#### **Electric scooters**

We have been asked by the Road Safety team to share the following information with you to ensure you are fully informed about electric scooters.

E-Scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It is not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it is illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as pavements. The police are obliged to take action against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances, the police have the power to seize the e-scooter . You risk a £300 fine, six penalty points endorsed on your driving licence and the E-Scooter being seized. Kent Fire and Rescue Service have issued a safety warning on the use of lithium-ion batteries following several battery related fires across the county. Lithium-ion batteries are commonly found in many items including mobile phones, laptops, e-bikes, hover boards and e-scooters. Firefighters are urging the public to take care when storing and using these types of batteries, and to think twice before purchasing items from non-reputable suppliers.
